The Ascension – Friends in high places

I imagine that if most Christians are honest, the ascension of Jesus into heaven is one Bible story we wish hadn't happened. After all, wouldn't it be so much easier to convince people that Jesus had really risen from the dead if he still had an address in Nazareth and regularly appeared on TV? And aren't Christians supposed to be eagerly looking forward to his

return? So why have a festival dedicated to celebrating his leaving us in the first place?

In the Bible, the ascension isn't treated as a sad reality or an embarrassing liability but a source of great joy and confidence. For the early Christians, it was proof that Jesus is

no longer leading a local movement, confined to Galilee and Judaea. He is ruling the universe from God's throne room in heaven. And, as our reading

from Hebrews shows us today, it also means that the same Jesus who loves

us and died for us is now pleading our cause before God in heaven.

Read Mark

Mark 8:14-26 (NIVUK)



- ¹⁴ The disciples had forgotten to bring bread, except for one loaf they had with them in the boat. ¹⁵ 'Be careful,' Jesus warned them. 'Watch out for the yeast of the Pharisees and that of Herod.'
- ¹⁶ They discussed this with one another and said, 'It is because we have no bread.'
- ¹⁷ Aware of their discussion, Jesus asked them: 'Why are you talking about having no bread? Do you still not see or understand? Are your hearts hardened? ¹⁸ Do you have eyes but fail to see, and ears but fail to hear? And don't you remember? ¹⁹ When I broke the five loaves for the five thousand, how many basketfuls of pieces did you pick up?' 'Twelve,' they replied.
- 20 'And when I broke the seven loaves for the four thousand, how many basketfuls of pieces did you pick up?'

They answered, 'Seven.'

- ²¹ He said to them, 'Do you still not understand?'
- ²² They came to Bethsaida, and some people brought a blind man and begged Jesus to touch him. ²³ He took the blind man by the hand and led him outside the village. When he had spat on the man's eyes and put his hands on him, Jesus asked, 'Do you see anything?'
- ²⁴ He looked up and said, 'I see people; they look like trees walking around.'
- ²⁵ Once more Jesus put his hands on the man's eyes. Then his eyes were opened, his sight was restored, and he saw everything clearly. ²⁶ Jesus sent him home, saying, 'Don't even go into the village.'
