## Word for The Week: Sure and Steadfast

This week we are welcoming the 1st Newbury Boys' Brigade Company, to give thanks for the opportunity to partner with them, to pray for them and to dedicate the Company as they make St Mary's their new home. The motto of the Boys' Brigade, "sure & steadfast", is taken from a verse in the Bible. "We have this [hope] as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul" Heb 6:19a (ESV). Why is that hope so sure and steadfast? In the verses just before, the writer tells us that God has not only promised to give eternal life to those who trust in Jesus – he's sworn an oath to do so. Our sure and steadfast hope is grounded in God's completely trustworthy promises.

# Read Mark 14:53-65 (NIV)

<sup>53</sup> They took Jesus to the high priest, and all the chief priests, the elders and the teachers of the law came together. <sup>54</sup> Peter followed him at a distance, right into the courtyard of the high priest. There he sat with the guards and warmed himself at the fire.

<sup>55</sup> The chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for evidence against Jesus so that they could put him to death, but they did not find any.
<sup>56</sup> Many testified falsely against him, but their statements did not agree.
<sup>57</sup> Then some stood up and gave this false testimony against him: <sup>58</sup> "We heard him say, 'I will destroy this temple made with human hands and in three days will build another, not made with hands.' "

<sup>59</sup> Yet even then their testimony did not agree.

<sup>60</sup> Then the high priest stood up before them and asked Jesus, "Are you not going to answer? What is this testimony that these men are bringing against you?" <sup>61</sup> But Jesus remained silent and gave no answer.

Again the high priest asked him, "Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed One?" <sup>62</sup> "I am," said Jesus. "And you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Mighty One and coming on the clouds of heaven." <sup>63</sup> The high priest tore his clothes. "Why do we need any more witnesses?" he asked. <sup>64</sup> "You have heard the blasphemy. What do you think?"

They all condemned him as worthy of death. <sup>65</sup> Then some began to spit at him; they blindfolded him, struck him with their fists, and said, "Prophesy!" And the guards took him and beat him.
