# Word for the week -

# Everyone's invited, no exceptions

Last week, in Isaiah 55, we saw that God is making an open invitation to come and find satisfaction in him. This week, God addresses two groups who may have been tempted to think that this invitation doesn't apply to them. Both groups are reassured by God that their background is no barrier to receiving God's salvation; if they trust in him and keep his covenant, they will be accepted along with everyone else.

God is still making his invitation to the world today. Through Jesus, God is gathering people from every nation on earth to himself. But as in Isaiah's time, there are still people who may assume that the invitation is not really offered to them. This week, why not take some time to think who those people might be, why they might think God doesn't want to invite them, and whether there's anything we do that might give them that impression. God still has more people to gather in Shaw.

### Read Mark 1: 35-45

### Jesus Prays in a Solitary Place

<sup>35</sup> Very early in the



morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. <sup>36</sup> Simon and his companions went to look for him, <sup>37</sup> and when they found him, they exclaimed: "Everyone is looking for you!" <sup>38</sup> Jesus replied, "Let us go somewhere else—to the nearby villages—so I can preach there also. That is why I have come." <sup>39</sup> So he traveled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons.

#### Jesus Heals a Man With Leprosy

<sup>40</sup> A man with leprosy<sup>[a]</sup> came to him and begged him on his knees, "If you are willing, you can make me clean."

<sup>41</sup> Jesus was indignant.<sup>[b]</sup> He reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!" <sup>42</sup> Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cleansed.

<sup>43</sup> Jesus sent him away at once with a strong warning: <sup>44</sup> "See that you don't tell this to anyone. But go, show yourself to the priest and offer the sacrifices that Moses commanded for your cleansing, as a testimony to hem." <sup>45</sup> Instead he went out and began to talk freely, spreading the news.
