Almighty and everlasting God, you have given us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity and in the power of the divine

Trinity

This Sunday, the Church celebrates a festival which is unusual in that it celebrates not an event, like Christmas, Easter or Pentecost, but an idea: the doctrine of the Trinity. It comes at this time of year because the doctrine of the Trinity is what happens when you step back from the details of the story told in the Gospels and Acts to look at the big picture. The events which bring about our salvation are Trinity shaped. God the Father sent his Son into the world to die for our sins and, after he had risen from the dead and ascended to the Father's side, the Son pours out the Spirit from the Father to renew us from the inside out.

Because salvation is Trinity shaped, the whole Christian life is Trinity shaped. In this Sunday's passage from Romans, Paul reminds us how the ministry of the Son and Spirit opens the door to peace, grace, joy, love and hope in our relationship with God the Father. The Trinity, then, isn't just a doctrine to be believed, but a reality to rejoice in – even, as we'll see, in the face of our struggles with sin and suffering.
