Word for the week - Who?

When Isaiah was called by God, it began with a vision of The LORD on the throne. It was something awe-full.

Isaiah was brought first into the presence of God, where he recognised and was purged of his sin, and then God asked a simple question.

As we gather in church Sunday by Sunday, do we ever sense the awe of what it means to be in the presence of Almighty God? And if we do, and then realise that we brought sinfulness into a Holy Place, do we stop and wonder at the way our sin is taken away as the minister pronounces us forgiven? 'God with us' also means us with God, but it is God's initiative rather than ours.

And Jesus' death on a cross, means our sin is removed from God's presence – but without removing us.

So what about the question? Does it still linger in the air for us to hear? And if it does, how shall we respond?

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?"

And I said "Here am I, Send me!" Isaiah 6:8



Mark 2:13-22

Jesus Calls Levi and Eats With Sinners

13 Once again Jesus went out beside the lake. A



15 While Jesus was having dinner at Levi's house, many tax collectors and sinners were eating with him and his disciples, for there were many who followed him. 16 When the teachers of the law who were Pharisees saw him eating with the sinners and tax collectors, they asked his disciples: "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?"

17 On hearing this, Jesus said to them, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."

Jesus Questioned About Fasting

18 Now John's disciples and the Pharisees were fasting. Some people came and asked Jesus, "How is it that John's disciples and the disciples of the Pharisees are fasting, but yours are not?" 19 Jesus answered, "How can the guests of the bridegroom fast while he is with them? They cannot, so long as they have him with them. 20 But the time will come when the bridegroom will be taken from them, and on that day they will fast. 21 "No one sews a patch of unshrunk cloth on an old garment. Otherwise, the new piece will pull away from the old, making the tear worse. 22 And no one pours new wine into old wineskins. Otherwise, the wine will burst the skins, and both the wine and the wineskins will be ruined. No, they pour new wine into new wineskins."
