Jesus' parables are one of the ways he brought faith and life together – because they are inseparable.

This week, we continue looking at Jesus application of principles to life in the stories he told and how he responded to people he met. The parable of the Rich Fool is Jesus' response to a man wanting justice. Am I a rich fool? Or just a fool? And will I embrace the justice that Jesus teaches? *Raymond*
