Advent means hopeful repentance

Today's reading from 1 John includes my favourite verse for thinking about Advent. "All who have this hope in him purify themselves as he is pure" (1 John 3:3). It's a favourite of mine because it reminds us that Jesus' return, when we will see him as he is and finally be like him, is our great hope for the future (3:2). All too often, Jesus' return has been a cause for fear as Christians worry if they will be ready for him when he comes. But if we continue as his disciples to the end, that day can be one of joy and not of fear (2:28).

It's also a favourite of mine because it. shows what an active thing hope is. Jesus' return isn't just a (possibly) distant reality, something that we look forward to, but that doesn't really affect our lives. Nor is it just something we can use to comfort ourselves in the hard moments, secure in the knowledge that it will all be alright in the end. This hope changes us now. If we hope to be like Jesus in the future, we should be pushing to be as much like him as possible now. And that means repentance. But not a gloomy repentance filled with regret – a joyful repentance filled with hope and the assurance that every time we repent of our sins, we are a little closer to the joy of being like Jesus forever.

- ⁵⁷ When it was time for Elizabeth to have her baby, she gave birth to a son.
- ⁵⁸ Her neighbours and relatives heard that the Lord had shown her great mercy, and they shared her joy.
- ⁵⁹ On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him after his father Zechariah, ⁶⁰ but his mother spoke up and said, "No! He is to be called John."
- ⁶¹ They said to her, "There is no one among your relatives who has that name."
- ⁶² Then they made signs to his father, to find out what he would like to name the child. ⁶³ He asked for a writing tablet, and to everyone's astonishment he wrote, "His name is John." ⁶⁴ Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue set free, and he began to speak, praising God. ⁶⁵ All the neighbours were filled with awe, and throughout the hill country of Judea people were talking about all these things. ⁶⁶ Everyone who heard this wondered about it, asking, "What then is this child going to be?" For the Lord's hand was with him.
