# Ministers' Weekly

#### Keeping the main thing the main thing

One of the most exciting truths about the Gospel is that it embraces people from every culture on earth. From the Roman Empire to the space age, and from Jerusalem and Judea to the ends of the Earth, the Gospel is the power of God to save everyone who believes. (Romans 1:16)

But where there are so many different peoples and cultures in the church, there are bound to be differences of opinion and practise. What seems natural and normal in one culture can be highly offensive in another. Even within the same culture, differences of conscience are common.

Whenever a disagreement arises, it's vitally important to maintain a sense of perspective. Sometimes it really is worth arguing about something, especially if a core matter of principle is at stake. But many disagreements are about things of lesser importance. In these cases, the argument may actually be more damaging than the difference that started it.

In this week's Roman's reading, Paul helps us navigate our differences by putting the things that truly matter at the centre; the call to love one another and the righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit which characterise Christ's Kingdom.

#### Read Mark Mark 10:1-16 (NIV)

#### Divorce



<sup>1</sup> Jesus then left that place and went into the region of Judea and across the Jordan. Again, crowds of people came to him, and as was his custom, he taught them.

<sup>2</sup> Some Pharisees came and tested him by asking, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?"

<sup>3</sup> "What did Moses command you?" he replied.

<sup>4</sup> They said, "Moses permitted a man to write a certificate of divorce and send her away."

<sup>5</sup> "It was because your hearts were hard that Moses wrote you this law," Jesus replied. <sup>6</sup> "But at the beginning of creation God 'made them male and female.' <sup>7</sup> 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, <sup>8</sup> and the two will become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one flesh. <sup>9</sup> Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

<sup>10</sup> When they were in the house again, the disciples asked Jesus about this. <sup>11</sup> He answered, "Anyone who divorces his wife and marries another woman commits adultery against her. <sup>12</sup> And if she divorces her husband and marries another man, she commits adultery."

#### The Little Children and Jesus

<sup>13</sup> People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them. <sup>14</sup> When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them,

"Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. <sup>15</sup> Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it."

<sup>16</sup> And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them and blessed them.
