Word for The Week: Why Grow?

I have a tree my garden. I chose it, I planted it, and I watch it. It grows very slowly, unlike some other plants (notably the weeds and the leylandii hedge) which grow much too quickly. My tree just gets on with things at its own pace, in its own way.

But it is growing. I know, because it has new leaves every year; I know because the trunk is just a little bit bigger this year than it was last year. When Jesus used plant-parables (vines, wheat, fig tree) to help explain the Kingdom of God, the plants not only grow, but produce fruit. From the plants point of view, fruit is all about the next generation; from the farmer or forager's point of view, fruit is all about food – the overabundance of what grows, becoming a blessing for birds, animals and humans.

Jesus said [to Simon Peter] "Feed my sheep" John 20:17.



Read Mark

Mark 12:35-44 (NIV)

35 While Jesus was teaching in the temple courts, he asked, "Why do the teachers of the law say that the Messiah is the son of David? 36 David himself, speaking by the Holy Spirit, declared:"

'The Lord said to my Lord: "Sit at my right hand until I put your enemies under your feet." '

- ³⁷ David himself calls him 'Lord.' How then can he be his son?" The large crowd listened to him with delight.
- ³⁸ As he taught, Jesus said, "Watch out for the teachers of the law. They like to walk around in flowing robes and be greeted with respect in the marketplaces, ³⁹ and have the most important seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets. ⁴⁰ They devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. These men will be punished most severely.
- ⁴¹ Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. ⁴² But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents.
- ⁴³ Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. ⁴⁴ They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on."

Christian Resources still available






