Word for the Week

This week, the Church is celebrating Bible Sunday. But what is the Bible actually for – what's the point of it?

There are many answers to that question, but one of the most important is that the Bible teaches us how to love. In our Gospel reading today (Mark 12:28-34), Jesus tells us that the greatest commandments in the Old Testament are, firstly, that we love God with all our hearts and secondly, that we love our neighbours as our selves.

But the Bible doesn't just command us to love and leave us to get one with it. It also empowers us to love by drawing us into its story. As we reflect on the love God showed to us in Christ – the love that led Jesus to die for us on the cross – we see at its deepest level what true love looks like. The more we grasp that this love has been shown to us, the more we are reshaped by it so as to love God and those around us. Our ingrained selfishness is broken down by the saving love of God revealed in the Bible.

Read Mark 15:1-15 (NIV)

- ¹ Very early in the morning, the chief priests, with the elders, the teachers of the law and the whole Sanhedrin, made their plans. So they bound Jesus, led him away and handed him over to Pilate.
- ² "Are you the king of the Jews?" asked Pilate.
- "You have said so," Jesus replied.
- ³ The chief priests accused him of many things. ⁴ So again Pilate asked him, "Aren't you going to answer? See how many things they are accusing you of." ⁵ But Jesus still made no reply, and Pilate was amazed.
- ⁶ Now it was the custom at the festival to release a prisoner whom the people requested. ⁷ A man called Barabbas was in prison with the insurrectionists who had committed murder in the uprising. ⁸ The crowd came up and asked Pilate to do for them what he usually did.
- ⁹ "Do you want me to release to you the king of the Jews?" asked Pilate,
- ¹⁰ knowing it was out of self-interest that the chief priests had handed Jesus over to him. ¹¹ But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have Pilate release Barabbas* instead.
- ¹² "What shall I do, then, with the one you call the king of the Jews?" Pilate asked them.
- ¹³ "Crucify him!" they shouted.
- ¹⁴ "Why? What crime has he committed?" asked Pilate.

But they shouted all the louder, "Crucify him!"

¹⁵ Wanting to satisfy the crowd, Pilate released Barabbas to them. He had Jesus flogged, and handed him over to be crucified.
