#### Collect

## **Friday Sunday**

If Jesus is risen (sorry, if you're reading this before Easter Sunday - but it is true!), why the focus on suffering of Lent and Holy Week? If it's all good news (and it really is Good News!) does it matter how we got there? In Romans, Paul talks about God's moral law where the consequence of sin is death. So we shouldn't be surprised if saving us from our sins involves death. Jesus' suffering (unimaginable to us – his entirely undeserved suffering, at the extremes of physical, mental and spiritual endurance) is hard for us to take. But shouldn't we reflect that our sin is also hard for God to forgive? Lent and Holy Week and Good Friday should lead us to worship the God who loves us so much.

But that was Friday, and we can call it 'Good' because of what happened on the following Sunday. God's power was demonstrated; Death is defeated; and we are saved.

"And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you." Rom 8:11.

## **Read Mark**

Mark 6:14-29

### John The Baptist Beheaded



- <sup>14</sup> King Herod heard about this, for Jesus' name had become well known. Some were saying, "John the Baptist has been raised from the dead, and that is why miraculous powers are at work in him."
- <sup>15</sup> Others said, "He is Elijah."

And still others claimed, "He is a prophet, like one of the prophets of long ago."

- $^{16}$  But when Herod heard this, he said, "John, whom I beheaded, has been raised from the dead!"
- <sup>17</sup> For Herod himself had given orders to have John arrested, and he had him bound and put in prison. He did this because of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, whom he had married. <sup>18</sup> For John had been saying to Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife."
- <sup>19</sup>So Herodias nursed a grudge against John and wanted to kill him. But she was not able to, <sup>20</sup> because Herod feared John and protected him, knowing him to be a righteous and holy man. When Herod heard John, he was greatly puzzled; yet he liked to listen to him.
- <sup>21</sup> Finally the opportune time came. On his birthday Herod gave a banquet for his high officials and military commanders and the leading men of Galilee. <sup>22</sup> When the daughter of Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his dinner guests.

The king said to the girl, "Ask me for anything you want, and I'll give it to you." <sup>23</sup> And he promised her with an oath, "Whatever you ask I will give you, up to half my kingdom." <sup>24</sup> She went out and said to her mother, "What shall I ask for?"

- "The head of John the Baptist," she answered.
- <sup>25</sup> At once the girl hurried in to the king with the request: "I want you to give me right now the head of John the Baptist on a platter."
- <sup>26</sup>The king was greatly distressed, but because of his oaths and his dinner guests, he did not want to refuse her. <sup>27</sup>So he immediately sent an executioner with orders to bring John's head. The man went, beheaded John in the prison, <sup>28</sup> and brought back his head on a platter. He presented it to the girl, and she gave it to her mother. <sup>29</sup>On hearing of this, John's disciples came and took his body and laid it in a tomb.

You may well have heard how you overwhelmed us all at West Berks Foodbank with your generosity at Harvest and



Christmas last year and the year ended with a very healthy stock level indeed at the warehouse. Thank you so much for your fantastic generosity and support last year. With your help, last year we were able to distribute over 140 tonnes of stock to:

- individuals and families facing difficulties in West Berkshire through the voucher system;
- support other organisations, like Loose Ends, Home Start, the Soup Kitchen to name a few;

Through the voucher system alone, over 8,000 people were helped., 40% of these were children.

The stock level has fallen at the start of 2024 with demand for help being greater than donations received. With the BBC news reporting last week that the UK has seen the biggest rise in absolute poverty for 30 years, the help provided by Foodbanks is sadly very necessary.
