### **Our Daily Bread**

When I was a child, I wasn't much of a fan of bread. White bread seemed boring and flavourless — at best a convenient vehicle to get jam into my mouth without getting sticky fingers. Brown bread seemed rough and unappealing — even now it makes me think of school dinner tomato soup. On this point, I found the Lord's Prayer, in which was ask God each day for our daily bread, thoroughly uninspiring.

This attitude was, of course, born of privilege. If I had understood how hard people work to produce our daily bread, or how many people still have to go without, I should have been more grateful. Harvest is a time when we give thanks to God for his generosity in providing for us and when we remember those who do not have enough. Our daily bread is a precious sign of God's continual care for each one of us. But in our Gospel reading today, Jesus has a challenge for us; what are we really hungry for? For he came not only to give us bread – bread that is here today and gone tomorrow, but to be bread for us, the bread of life, that we feed on for eternal satisfaction.
