Lord, raise up, we pray, your power and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness we are grievously hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be honour and glory, now and for ever.

Word for the Week

One of the key figures we remember during the season of Advent is John the Baptist. That's because he was sent by God to prepare people for Jesus' first coming. How might he help us prepare for Jesus second coming?

This week's passage shows us John in a moment of darkness and doubt. He is locked up in prison. We know, as he didn't, that he would eventually be executed. Things are going very differently to how he expected and he's starting to wonder whether Jesus really is the Messiah he'd thought he was.

Jesus' return is a common area of doubt for Christians today. Hasn't it been so long already? Many of our neighbours find it a bizarre or even comical belief, more suited to the Middle Ages than the 21st Century. Jesus encourages John by pointing him to the evidence of all he was doing. When he healed disease, cast out evil spirits, raised the dead and preached good news to the poor, it was a clear sign of God's Kingdom coming.

It should likewise encourage us. These signs are a preview of the world Jesus died to bring about. We should not lose hope that he will return to bring it to completion.

²⁶In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, ²⁷to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸The angel went to her and said, 'Greetings, you who are highly favoured! The Lord is with you.'

²⁹Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. ³⁰But the angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favour with God. ³¹You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. ³²He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, ³³and he will reign over Jacob's descendants for ever; his kingdom will never end.'
