What is the answer to the ultimate question of life, the universe and everything? That's the question a race of hyper intelligent aliens want to understand In Douglas Adams' Sci-Fi comedy, *The Hitchiker;s Guide to the Galaxy*. So they build a gigantic supercomputer called Deep Thought and ask it. 7.5 million years later, it comes back with the answer '42'. Not only is this answer incomprehensible, but it highlights another problem: the aliens don't know what exactly the ultimate question of life, the universe and everything *is*!

Douglas Adams is being playful, but he's also highlighting a serious issue – when it comes to *ultimate* issues, most of us are in a tangle of incomprehensible answers to half grasped questions.

But if we don't know what life, the universe and everything is about, is it any surprise if it all goes wrong? Today we're going to look at humanity's call to work and take care of the creation, because in it we see the Bible's answer to the ultimate question of life, the universe and everything.

Lord, you have taught us that all our doings without love are nothing worth: send your Holy Spirit and pour into our hearts that most excellent gift of love, the true bond of peace and of all virtues, without which whoever lives is counted dead before you. Grant this for your only Son Jesus Christ's sake, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever

Read Mark

Mark 9:14-29 (NIV)

- ¹⁴When they came to the other disciples, they saw a large crowd around them and the teachers of the law arguing with them. ¹⁵As soon as all the people saw Jesus, they were overwhelmed with wonder and ran to greet him.
- ¹⁶ "What are you arguing with them about?" he asked.
- ¹⁷ A man in the crowd answered, "Teacher, I brought you my son, who is possessed by a spirit that has robbed him of speech. ¹⁸ Whenever it seizes him, it throws him to the ground. He foams at the mouth, gnashes his teeth and becomes rigid. I asked your disciples to drive out the spirit, but they could not."
- ¹⁹ "You unbelieving generation," Jesus replied, "how long shall I stay with you? How long shall I put up with you? Bring the boy to me."
- ²⁰ So they brought him. When the spirit saw Jesus, it immediately threw the boy into a convulsion. He fell to the ground and rolled around, foaming at the mouth.
- ²¹ Jesus asked the boy's father, "How long has he been like this?" "From childhood," he answered. ²² "It has often thrown him into fire or water to kill him. But if you can do anything, take pity on us and help us."
- ²³ "'If you can'?" said Jesus. "Everything is possible for one who believes."
- ²⁴ Immediately the boy's father exclaimed, "I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!"
- ²⁵ When Jesus saw that a crowd was running to the scene, he rebuked the impure spirit. "You deaf and mute spirit," he said, "I command you, come out of him and never enter him again."
- ²⁶ The spirit shrieked, convulsed him violently and came out. The boy looked so much like a corpse that many said, "He's dead." ²⁷ But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him to his feet, and he stood up.
- ²⁸ After Jesus had gone indoors, his disciples asked him privately, "Why couldn't we drive it out?"
- ²⁹ He replied, "This kind can come out only by prayer."
